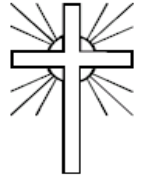

**Thoughts from today's Gospel Reading: Mark 10:17-30**

Enjoy yourself today by reading all three versions of  
 this story in Mark, Matthew and Luke. The differences  
 will surprise you. From Matthew we learn the man  
 was young, from Luke that he was of the ruling class,  
 but all three tell us he was rich. Jesus rejects the title  
 "Good Master" by which the man addresses him:  
 God alone is good, and Jesus leads him to see that  
 goodness (salvation) does not lie in obedience but in  
 acceptance of God and renunciation of worldly  
 wealth and power.

Notice the man has kept the commandments since  
 his youth – Matthew says he is a young man, so omits  
 that detail. Only Mark has that Jesus looked at him  
 and loved him, and whilst Matthew and Mark have  
 Jesus address his disciples on riches and discipleship -  
 in Luke the words seem to be directed to the young  
 man. The contrast is sad:

The rich (young) man (ruler) goes away,  
 The disciples stay.
