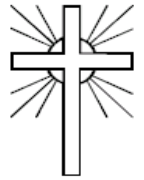

Today is Remembrance Sunday and we remember those killed in the 2 World Wars. We are conscious of those who died in World War 1 as we commemorate the 100 year anniversary of Armistice Day when the war "to end all wars" ended. Sadly, this was not the case. The memorial plaque at St Mary Crowned grotto, and the memorial plaque within All Saints Church help us to remember the families and individuals who belonged to our Churches and died in the war. One of our parishioners John Logan was caught by his name sake (Joseph Logan) featuring on one of these plaques and set about doing some research with information obtained from the Derbyshire War Memorials Project website, Forces War Records website, Glossop Library Local Studies section and Tony Wright (Parishioner). He was so interested that he continued to collate information re the other names which is reproduced here.

Comerford, John Joseph, Private, 2061, 6th Battalion, Cheshire Regiment, Born Cork. Enlisted Glossop, Derbyshire. Killed in action 10th May 1916 aged 33. Buried in Guards Cemetery, Windy Corner, Cuinchy, Ill, R, 4. 1911 Census, A cotton spinner, Husband of Mary Ellen, father of Annie, Joseph Edward, Jonathan & Cyril.

Nixon, Elias, Private, 203565, 2nd/4th Battalion, East Lancashire Regiment. Previous. Born Warrington, Lancashire. Enlisted Glossop, Derbyshire. Duty location – France and Flanders. Killed in action 21st March 1918 aged 38. Commemorated on the Pozieres Memorial. 1911 Census, A printworks labourer, Husband of Sarah Nixon, of 24, Thomas Street, Glossop, Derbyshire.

Kilfoyle, John James, Private, 35022, 1st Battalion, Cheshire Regiment. Born Glossop, Derbyshire. Duty location – France and Flanders. Killed in action 9th October 1917 aged 27. Commemorated on the Tyne Cot Memorial. 1911 Census, A cotton spinning mill bobbin carrier, Son of Henrietta Kilfoyle, of 14, Howard Street, Glossop, Derbyshire.

White, Herbert, Private, 4141, 13th Battalion, Royal Sussex Regiment. Born Glossop, Derbyshire. Killed in action 13th May 1916 aged 21. Buried in Le Touret Military Cemetery, Richebourg L'Avoue, Ill, F, 10. 1911 Census, A labourer at Hawkshead Mill, Old Glossop. Son of James and Ellen White, of 43, Hope Street, Glossop, Derbyshire.

Newsham, Walter, Private, 1779, 6th Battalion, Cheshire Regiment. Born Glossop, Derbyshire. Died of nephritis 29th January 1915 aged 35. Buried in St. Sever Cemetery, Rouen, A, 3, 7. 1911 Census, A general teamer. Lodging at the home of Polly Thorpe, of 11A, Bradford Road, Huddersfield.

Cleary, Michael Paul, Private, 16168, 2nd Battalion, Royal Dublin Fusiliers. Previously served with 1st Battalion, Royal Dublin Fusiliers. Born Brigg, Lincolnshire. Killed in action in the Somme Offensive 1st July 1916 aged 32. 1911 Census, A carpenter, Husband of Alice, and father of Nellie, Annie and William, of 58, Dunstall Street, Frodingham, Lincolnshire.

Connor, Frank, Lance Corporal, 2177, 8th (Ardwick) Battalion, Cheshire Regiment. Born Glossop. Medically discharged in 1916 due to bronchitis. 1911 Census, Born Glossop, 1894. A printworks roller boy, Son of John & Mary Connor, of 34, Church Street South, Glossop. Buried in Glossop Cemetery, 22nd January 1920, aged 25.

Brough, John, Private, 5984, 2nd Battalion, King's Shropshire Light Infantry. Born Glossop, Derbyshire. Duty location – France and Flanders. Died of wounds 22nd March 1915 aged 23. Buried in St. Sever Cemetery, Rouen, A, 6, 13. 1911 Census, A cotton spinner, Son of Margaret and William Brough, of 22, Mill Town, Glossop, Derbyshire.

Logan, Joseph, Private, 118446, 11th Battalion, Sherwood Foresters (Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment). Born Oldham, Resided Glossop, Derbyshire. Duty location – France and Flanders. Killed in action 31st October 1918 aged 26. Buried in Pommereuil British Cemetery, B, 47. 1911 Census, A cotton lap carrier. Son of Peter, and Ann Logan, of 13, Wellgate, Glossop, Derbyshire.

Bennett, James William, Private, 602276, 5th Canadian Mounted Rifles. Born Glossop, Derbyshire. Killed in action 1st / 2nd October 1916 aged 27. Husband of Emily Bennett. Buried in Regina Trench Cemetery, Grandcourt, Il, D, 10. 1911 Census, A bleachworks labourer, Son of Ezra, a Council labourer, and Mary Bennett, of Silk St, Glossop.

Howard, The Honourable Philip Granville James Fitzalan, Lieutenant, 1st Battalion, Welsh Guards. Born 15th April 1895, Westminster, Middlesex. Died of wounds 24th May 1918 aged 23. Son of Francis Edward Fitzalan Howard, 2nd Baron Howard of Glossop, and Lady Howard. Buried in Bac du Sud British Cemetery, Bailleulval, Il, D, 20. 1911 Census, Husband of Gladys Cecily Clara Howard (nee Norton).
